Culture

Early last month we evaluated our new project-based curriculum for social studies and science and determined that it was too much for the students to do both at once. In the month of September, third year students will continue to work on their separate science work plan for the topic of Sun/Earth/Moon. We will also begin using NC Studies Weekly, a weekly newspaper that covers 97% of the state standards for Social Studies. 4th year students will continue their social studies unit about the three regions of North Carolina. They will also begin using NC Studies Weekly as part of their social studies curriculum. All projects for both grades are due on September 16th. Please discuss with your child how their projects are coming along, as we're trying to avoid having children stuck with multiple projects left incomplete on, or just before, the due date.

Language

This month we will be focusing on persuasive writing. We will continue the writing process, and will also focus on using complete sentences in our writing. Students will be provided with a rubric for their written pieces that focus on organization, content, and conventions.
